### Research project

Informal economic practices have traditionally prevailed in the delivery services, domestic work and transportation sectors. Although the rise of digital economy implies the formalisation of riders, domestic workers and taxi drivers who were largely engaged in the informal realm of the economy, recent studies reveal that platform labour is still characterised by non-standard forms of employment. Therefore, this research project aims to explore the impact of digital labour platforms on workers whose employment has been characterised by informality in traditional labour markets. Drawing upon primary data that will be primarily collected through in-depth interviews with platform workers and stakeholders (e.g., unionists, platform providers) and secondary data, it will investigate how digital economy informs the continuum between the formal and informal realm of economy, and how workers represent their participation in platform work. Empirical material will be collected in Milan, as this city is considered a prominent tech hub with a variety of gig and sharing economy platforms. This project aims to contribute to the debate on platform workers' conditions and agency in developed countries, by engaging in dialogue with ongoing and already published studies. A comparative perspective across contexts characterised by different socio-economic, institutional and normative characteristics is expected to offer interesting insights on the topic of informal economy within platform work.

The project explores how European migration policies are influenced by political and economic crises in the frame of crescent international migration flows. The research unit of the University of Milan focuses on 1) the discursive construction of the crisis rhetoric; 2) the identification of the different local, national and international stakeholders involved in the governance process of migration and asylum, and their multiple ways of interaction; and 3) the multi-scalar study of the official and unofficial responses to the so called “refugee crisis”, emphasizing the role of the local authorities on facilitating (or hindering) the application of national policies on reception, redistribution and inclusion/exclusion of newcomers.

Dissertation Title: Migrant construction workers’ tactics to cope with unemployment during the crisis. Case study on Albanian immigrants in Milan and Athens

The thesis explores the agency of migrant construction workers in Southern Europe amidst the Great Recession. It is a systematic study to provide an account of migrant construction workers’ practices to resist and overcome structural barriers, investigating builders’ experiences within and beyond the workplace. It does so by comparatively analysing narratives of settled Albanian male migrants and those of different stakeholders in Italy and Greece.

The dissertation draws on qualitative data collected through 103 in–depth interviews with first–generation Albanian workers employed in residential construction, trade unionists, immigrant associations’ representatives, labour inspectors, and key informants, and through non–participant observation techniques. Fieldwork was conducted over the course of 16 months, from March 2015 to August 2016, in Milan and Athens.
