Lorenzo Bagnoli (Sanremo, 1968), graduated in Political Science in 1992 and in Geography in 1996 at the University of Genoa, obtaining in both cases the grade of 110/110 *cum laude*. At the same University, he eventually attended the Postgraduate Course in "International Development Cooperation" at the Faculty of Political Sciences in the academic year 1998-99, and got his PhD in "Geographical-environmental and cartographic sciences" in 2002.

In 2001, he was the winner of the ordinary competition for chairs in Geography at the secondary schools, where he has teaching for 6 years.

In 2007, he won the competition as a researcher in Geography at the Faculty of Sociology of the University of Milano-Bicocca and on April 1<sup>st</sup>, 2007 he entered his role at the Department of Sociology and Social Research.

Obtained the national scientific qualification of second-level professor in Geography in the first round (2012), he took up service on October 1<sup>st</sup> 2015 as associate professor in Geography at the Department of Sociology and Social Research of the University of Milano-Bicocca, following a competition.

He also obtained the national scientific qualification of full professor in Geography in the first quarter of 2016.

Currently he teaches Geography of tourism in the degree course in "STCL-Science of tourism and local community" and Geography of development in the master's degree in "TTSL-Tourism, territory and local development"

His duties in the Department have included: vice-president of the course in TTSL, responsible for the internationalization of the STCL and TTSL courses and of the department, scientific director of double degrees with Université de Savoie-Mont-Blanc and Universidad Rey Juan Carlos.

He did teaching as an Erasmus visiting professor in many European universities:
