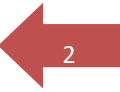

Nomination procedure	<p>Partner Universities send an e-mail to incoming.erasmus@unimib.it with the following data of the nominees: name, surname, date of birth, citizenship, gender, student e mail; Agreement ISCED code and cycle study (bachelor or master)</p> <p>WARNING: Citizenship data is required in order to start the visa request procedure. All students with an Extra EU citizenship have to request a visa (Type D: Study stays; valid for more than 90 days); application must be submitted through to University platform. Please check at link: Getting the Essentials Università degli Studi di Milano-Bicocca.</p> <p>For further information please contact: visa.applicationforstudy@unimib.it</p> <p>Regarding the permit of stay request, students have 8 working days from their arrival in Italy to fill in the kit for the request. Students can find a kit at a Poste Italiane office with a "Sportello Amico" (at the following link they'll be able to find the closest office).</p>

Application procedure	<p>Nominated students receive an e-mail from incoming.erasmus@unimib.it with the registration procedure in Segreteria Online (UniMiB University registry system), an acceptance letter and the instructions for application.</p> <p>WARNING: <i>Students are not allowed to enrol before receiving instructions and must not submit the Learning Agreement (LA) before being officially enrolled.</i></p>
Welcome events	<p><u>"Welcome day"</u></p> <p>Autumn Term: the last week of September</p> <p>Spring Term: the last week of February</p> <p>This event is mandatory and students will receive all details via mail.</p>
	<p><u>"How to" session</u></p> <p>This mandatory event will help students become familiar with UniMiB platforms. The students will learn how to gain access with their credentials, find the study subjects and more.</p>
Course catalogue for Incoming Students	<p><u>Course Catalogue- Incoming Students Università degli Studi di Milano-Bicocca (unimib.it)</u></p> <p>WARNING: Students can enter in Learning Agreement a maximum of two exams from another Department than their own. In any case, the number of credits to be achieved in a Department other than their own cannot exceed 50% of the total credits entered in the Learning Agreement.</p>
Required Language skills	<p>-B1 Italian or Unimib compulsory Italian course for courses taught in Italian;</p> <p>-B2 English for courses taught in English.</p>

	<p>Documents accepted: OLS test results, official language certificates (i.e. TOEFL, IELTS, Cambridge University, etc.), certificates issued by University officers/professors attesting the language proficiency level.</p>
Italian Language Course	<p>Students who do not have a B1 level of Italian are required to attend the Italian language course that is held at the beginning of each semester. An entry test will assess the level of Italian and assign students to the most suitable class. The attendance of the course is mandatory. At the end of the course, students can take the final exam and earn 3 ECTS points for their language proficiency. Student Visa	<p>All students with an Extra EU citizenship have to request a visa; application must be submitted through to Universitaly platform. e mail: visa.applicationforstudy@unimib.it</p>
Campus Insurance	<p>UniMiB pays a campus insurance for all the Erasmus mobility students. This insurance only covers accidents that occur on the University facilities.</p> <p>In case of accidents on campus write to assicurazioni@unimib.it within 24 h. e mail: assicurazioni@unimib.it</p>
Insurance for Erasmus Traineeship	<p>UniMiB will provide liability insurance and accident insurance for the trainee.</p> <p>The accident insurance covers accidents during outings related to the traineeship and accidents on the way to work and back from work.</p> <p>For further information on this topic, please contact: assicurazioni@unimib.it</p>

Tax code

The tax code or “codice fiscale” is issued by the Ministry of Finance [Agenzia delle Entrate](#). The **Tax Code** / Fiscal code / Codice Fiscale is a code made of letters and numbers that identifies a person in public administration forms, in private contracts, and money transfers. Agenzia delle Entrate has clarified that the Tax Code is not a prerequisite for contract registration.
