Knowledge of the practical applications in specific professional contexts of the fundamental notions acquired in Private Law and Business Law.

The unfair competition in the system of tort law.
Interfering and non-interfering unfair competition.
The prohibition of the so called “differential competition” in agency, employment, sale of firm, corporation.
A legal analysis of the so called “Data Economy” (contracts, intellectual property, competition). The EU Regulations GDPR, DSA, DMA, DGA, DA, AIA. Personal and non-personal data. The apparently free digital services. Digital platforms and gatekeepers. The “data altruism” principle and the function of intermediaries. Sharing versus secrets. The Algorithm of AI as a industrial secret.

Prerequisites

Private and Commercial Law is preparatory to both Teaching Units of the Business and Competition Law (both the “Intellectual Property and Competition Contracts” Module and the “Business and Corporate Law” Module).

Teaching methods

Class lectures in italian language of Explanation Teaching (42 academic hours).
