

Documents required to Marco Polo candidates:

You will be required to upload in “Segreteria online” the documents listed below during the application to the selection/evaluation test:

For enrolment in a Bachelor's/first cycle degree (3 years) or single cycle Master's degree program (5 or 6 years):

1. Final original certificate of secondary school studies, received after *at least 12 years of education*, or a legally valid substitute certificate, along with the translation into Italian.
2. Certificate indicating that you have passed the “Gao Kao” exam with a score of at least 400/750. For students coming from Hong Kong and Macao, who are not requested to pass the Gao Kao exam, the Italian Diplomatic Mission will evaluate the validity of the documentation needed in order to enrol in an Italian University.
3. “Dichiarazione di Valore in loco” (Declaration of Value), issued by the relevant Italian Embassy or Consulate. This is a document that provides information about the Educational System in your Country and compares the qualification level with the Italian Educational System.
4. A certificate issued by the Center where you took the Italian language course, indicating that your Italian level is not lower than B1 (according to the Common European Framework of Reference for Languages).
5. Study Visa.
6. Pre-enrolment form, stamped by the Italian Embassy.

- For enrolment in a Master's degree program (postgraduate degree -2 years):

1. University degree achieved in a foreign University, along with the translation into Italian.
2. the transcript of records, awarded by the University, detailing exams passed and marks, along with the translation into Italian.
3. if available, detailed program (syllabus) for each course, along with the translation into Italian.
4. Dichiarazione di Valore in loco (Declaration of Value), issued by the relevant Italian Embassy or Consulate. This is a document that provides information about the Educational System in your Country and compares the qualification level with the Italian Educational System.
5. A certificate issued by the Center where you took the Italian language course, indicating that your Italian level is not lower than B1 (according to the Common European Framework of Reference for Languages).
6. Study Visa;
7. Pre-enrolment form, stamped by the Italian Embassy.
